Marin Community Foundation Announces Betsy Campbell as the New Chief Philanthropy Officer

Following an extensive nationwide search, the [Marin Community Foundation](https://marincf.org) (MCF) is pleased to announce the hire of a new Chief Philanthropy Officer to lead the philanthropic work we do in partnership with over 600 donors across the country and the world.

Elizabeth (Betsy) Campbell comes to MCF as a seasoned philanthropic leader and executive, most recently serving as the Executive Vice President at the Rockefeller Brothers Fund (RBF) in New York. During her 18-year tenure at RBF, she oversaw more than \$650 million in program grantmaking, spanning domestic and international initiatives as diverse as the COVID-19 pandemic to democracy movements in the Middle East to climate resilience efforts. Additionally, she advanced nearly \$19 million to advance and strengthen the practice of philanthropy.

Stephen B. Heintz, the President of the Rockefeller Brothers Fund reflected, *“Betsy approached every facet of her work with wisdom, diplomacy, and warmth. I have watched colleagues, peers, and newcomers alike gravitate toward Betsy for her insight, advice, or a laugh. Prior to RBF, Betsy spent 12 years at the Ford Foundation, in senior programmatic roles, overseeing a broad array of community development and rural poverty grantmaking initiatives.

Betsy received a BSFS at Georgetown University and an MA in International Relations at Johns Hopkins University. She has occupied positions on several boards throughout her career, and currently serves as a trustee for the Trust for Mutual Understanding and as a member of the Council on Foreign Relations.

Betsy is relocating from New York to Marin County and will commence her position at MCF on April 14, 2026.
