In late 2024, a coalition of family offices and philanthropic foundations convened with a shared goal: to mobilize funding to these energy projects, and the concept of Energy Catalyst Fund I ("the Fund") emerged from this collaboration. Launched by ImpactAssets Capital Partners (IA Capital)*, an SEC-registered investment adviser and public benefit limited liability company, Energy Catalyst Fund I is stepping in to accelerate funding for clean energy solutions with a focus on low-to-moderate income communities across the United States. A catalytic debt fund, the Fund will invest in Green Banks, CDFIs, and other mission-aligned intermediaries, as well as alongside them, directly into clean energy projects.

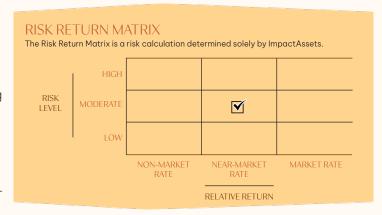
Energy Catalyst Fund I addresses a growing backlog of clean energy projects that are fundamentally sound and urgently need capital to reach completion. The Fund will make investments supporting a range of project types, including distributed energy generation and storage, energy efficiency upgrades and building electrification. The Fund will prioritize projects and deployments in low-to-moderate income communities and may also include projects in multifamily housing, small businesses and low-income single family residences.

The Fund is targeting a 4% net internal rate of return (IRR) to investors. In addition to investor capital, the Fund is raising grant funding to enable catalytic terms for borrowers. This opportunity is best suited for an investor comfortable with a long-term horizon and moderate financial risk; however, the Fund is supported by a tranche of first-loss capital.

ENERGY CATALYST FUND'S IMPACT

The Fund will deliver measurable environmental and social impact by catalyzing clean energy projects, especially those that benefit low-to-moderate income communities. Its impact strategy is aligned with leading industry standards for impact measurement and management (IMM), assessing impact performance by capturing impact outputs and outcomes data. Sample impact metrics may include:



- Megawatts of installed renewable energy capacity
- Estimated energy cost savings
- Metric tons of CO2 emissions avoided
- · Number of households/business receiving clean energy access or energy efficiency improvements
- Percentage of projects benefiting low-to-moderate income communities

The Fund's impact strategy is embedded in its investment approach, governance and monitoring processes, and is aligned with leading industry standards for an impact measurement and management framework. Strong team: The team has been compiled over a decade from leading institutional investment managers and leverages its extensive experience and a long track record across clean energy finance, catalytic capital deployment, and mission-aligned fund management.
RISKS	 Policy and regulatory risk: Delays or changes in federal programs may affect project timelines or viability. The Fund will mitigate this risk by underwriting investments to stand on their own merit and by building contingency planning into investment structures. Refinancing and takeout risk: Some investments may rely on future refinancing or takeout capital, which may be uncertain in the current interest rate environment. The Fund will mitigate this risk by assessing the credibility of takeout strategies, underwriting to commercial standards (when there is no takeout pre-committed), and designing appropriate invest-
